This year Ash Wednesday falls on February 14th, St. Valentine's Day. The last time this happened was in 1945. Now, at first I thought it was a fun, random little quirk of the calendar, but the closer we come to the date the more



I am convinced that there's a beauty to the beginning of Lent falling on this holiday celebrating love.

February 14th used to be (and technically still is) the feast day of St. Valentine who was a priest in Rome in the 3rd Century. We remember him on February 14th because that's the day he was executed by the Romans. The holiday eventually came to focus on love, in part, because St. Valentine was originally arrested for marrying Christian couples when it was illegal to do so. Now “Valentine's Day” is less about St. Valentine and more about chocolate and flowers and romantic love.

This year February 14th is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent - the season in which we ponder again what Jesus' death means for all of us. On Ash Wednesday we will gather and receive a cross of ashes on our foreheads and hear the reality, “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.” We will acknowledge our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We will remember that God's

amazing love saves us from the finality of death. We will remember that our best response to God's gracious love, is to love God and our neighbors. For this reason we have chosen the hymn “What Wondrous Love is This” as a Lenten focus.

This hymn speaks to the wonder that we are loved by a God who would go to such lengths for each of us.

May Lent 2018 help you remember how much God's love has done for you. May the season confirm for you that you are God's beloved child. May the love of God connect you to one another and send you out to share the love of God with others. May this Valentine's Day / Ash Wednesday begin a season filled with love that carries forward throughout the year!



Quilting



Imagine the comfort that comes from a hug at the time when you need it most. That's the feeling you can share with an LWR Quilt. Through a simple combination of fabric and thread, you can reach out to people in their time of greatest need with a strong message of hope — you are not alone, according to the Lutheran World Relief Website.

First and foremost, recipients use their LWR Quilts to shield against the cold and rain, and for warm bedding. But their versatility also makes the quilts useful as simple tents, floor coverings, or a wrap to hold a baby on a mother's back.

What You Can Do:

1. Come to church to **tie quilts** February 6 and 22, anytime from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. If you can stay through noon, please bring a sack lunch.
2. **Cut** 10½ inch squares at home using fabric from church or from home. Call Ruth Urdahl at 952-1733 for more information
3. **Assemble** kits of 48 cut squares for home quilting.
4. **Sew** the kits into 60 X 80 inch quilt tops at home.
5. **Donate** thread or large pieces of fabric or colored sheets for quilt backs

Darald and Ellen's Love Story

The secret to staying married for over half a century is to know "there was a time to speak and a time to be silent and ask for God's love to make the decision," according to Darald Olson. He and Ellen have been married for 56 years.

The pair met in school, but weren't a couple until later when Ellen was teaching at a country school in Deer Lake. Darald, a pilot, was friends with the man Ellen's roommate was courting in the early 1960s. "He buzzed me with his airplane," Ellen said.

Darald, who lived near the school on his family's farm, and Ellen double dated with their friends at first. She liked his kindness. "He was very kind to animals and his mother," she said adding that she always said she would never marry a farmer.

He loved everything about her, he just knew it was meant to be.

The couple married in 1961. Darald continued to farm while Ellen took care of the couple's three children: Beth, Stephen and Owen. She also took care of the farm books, fed the men and was the gopher. "I would go for this and go for that", she said. For fun, the couple liked to fly together.

Darald still operates the family farm with Owen and he still flies, though Ellen doesn't fly with him any more.

What is the secret to a happy marriage according to Ellen? Compromise and each partner having their own things to do.
